


New Release of "My Family History"

A ten-generation family history research record book with pedigree charts

Robert Boyd Publications (UK) is pleased to announce the release of the 3rd Edition of 'My Family History Record Book' and the appointment of the **Genealogical Society of Queensland** as it sole distributor for Australia, New Zealand and their territories.

My Family History is an efficient and attractive method of recording and displaying the results of family history research. It can be used as a presentation document to family members and as a handy aide memoire to carry around when researching

The product is in two main parts: a ten-generation record book and an 84x56cms loose leaf, two-sided ten-generation pedigree chart, plus a system for recording remarriages or new partnerships.



This 3rd edition allows the recording of ancestors back to 7x great grandparents; 512 marriages, 1024 direct ancestors plus offspring and siblings, stretching back to the early 1700's and beyond. All individuals are allocated unique reference numbers to match entries in the record book with those on the pedigree charts. The referencing system also provides an automatic filing system for related documents and data on ancestors held elsewhere. The new 2021 edition now includes a facility to record that the 1939 Register and 1921 Census have been interrogated in respect of appropriate ancestors.

The 'My Family History Ten-Generation Pedigree Chart' is also available separately.

Passenger Lists - Victoria, Australia Outwards to New Zealand 1852-1923

Transcription of passenger lists of the ships leaving Victoria, Australia for New Zealand ports, as contained in VPRS 948 Outward Passenger Lists 1852-1923.

These were originally published as 4 sets of fiche:

Part 1, 1852-1860 Part 2, 1861-1865 Part 3, 1866-1870 Part 4, 1871-1880.

This CD contains all the data from the four published sets of fiche plus remaining data transcribed up to and including 1923. The index contains a total of 368,481 passenger records and 5040 ship records covering the years 1852-1923. It is searchable by Passenger, Ship and Port of Arrival.
